MORNING ENRICHMENT CLASSES Spring 2012

Around the World with Arts and Crafts taught by Terri R.

Kindergarten-1st Grade

Class Description: We will take a country, learn a bit about it and do a child version of a traditional craft from the area.

Drama: Character Creation taught by Samantha H.

2nd-4th Grade

Class Description: This term, I will be coaching the kids through the basics of creating a character or characters. Last term I had a couple of students that expressed interest in writing a skit or monologue. I will be giving them the opportunity to do just that. From there, we'll work on casting, directing, and maybe even costume design, and how important all these things are to a great performance. Math Chefs taught by Sherri L.

2nd-5th Grade

Class Description: Just as cookies go with milk and peanut butter goes with jelly, math and cooking go hand in hand. Join us as we practice math while we cook!

AFTERNOON ENRICHMENT CLASSES Spring 2012

Wacky Weather taught by Wendy C.

Kindergarten-2nd Grade

Class Description: Weather happens all the time. We talk about it and experience it, but why does it happen? Each week we'll learn about meteorological phenomena: air, the water cycle, clouds, snow, rain, temperature, wind, tornadoes, hurricanes, thunder, and lightning. We'll use science experiments and crafts to explore the amazing atmosphere God created for us.

Number Games taught by Trisch W.

2nd-4th Grade

Class Description: Are your children bored with math drills, are you sick of checking their work? We have been enjoying Math Games to help solidify the basic math concepts in a fun way. Games advance incrementally with the child and can be used from Pre-K through multiplication/division and fractions. I will also be talking about tricks they can use to help solve math in their head. No paper, except to keep score and card sets can be purchased for \$5/set if desired. Not a requirement. I plan to begin with basic addition games and advance through to whatever each child is ready to do. Many games can be played individually or as a team with slight modification of set-up, strategy or rules.

Drawing taught by Heather H. and Jennifer P.

4th-12th Grade

Class Description: We will be learning and practicing drawing skills and techniques. If you took my class last term, be ready to take a more technical and focused approach to drawing this time. Each student will need a drawing pad/sketch book. Please bring this to the first day of class on February 10th.

5th-12th Grade

Class Description: The focus will be fun and exercise by learning traditional exercises gym games. Please come prepared to run with tennis shoes.

HSC Academic Class Descriptions

Saxon Math 87/Pre-Algebra: taught by Cheri R.

Cost: \$325 (\$32.50 per month for 10 months)

Text: Saxon 87 Second Edition (about \$8 used) ISBN 1-56577-188-5

Supplies: GOOD QUALITY compass and protractor, and ruler

This class will use an incremental, cyclical learning approach to teaching the foundational skill set needed for success in algebra. "Incremental" means that concepts are introduced in a logical sequence over several lessons and "cyclical" means that previously taught topics are reviewed throughout the year. The class will also include topics in Geography and introductory Algebra concepts.

Homework: Approx 3 hrs/week

Physics: taught by Cheri R.

Prerequisite: Algebra 1

Cost: \$350 (\$35 per month for 10 months)

Text: Conceptual Physics Third Edition ISBN 0-201-46697-X

This class will cover topics in mechanics (relations between force, matter, and motion), and properties of matter. Class time will consist of lecture, problem solving, and labs.

Writing - "The Voice": taught by Theresa W.

Cost: \$300 (\$30 per month for 10 months)

Materials: Write Shop II Student Workbook

Please join our group as we explore classic English composition in an attempt to find and define your own voice. Appropriate emphasis will be placed on English grammar, sentence structure and spelling. The intention behind the exercises, however, will be gifting students not only with strong roots but also with wings that they can use to express their own voice. Parental involvement on a weekly basis will be necessary. Students will be responsible for competing weekly assignments and turning in correctly formatted writing projects. The class will be participating in the national "Write a Novel in Month" during the month of November and may visit writers groups with the intention of meeting professional writers and sharing our work. (all levels welcome)

Homework: 30 min/day (parents 1 to 2 hr/wk)

*these are full year classes already underway. Therefore, the enrollment is limited and subject to approval mid-year.
